Anthropology 101 AA Human Ecology I

Help tribes, governments and non-profits make fishing, farming and forestry more sustainable while studying relationships between people and ecosystems. Carpool to and from field sites. Register for 0448. See LEAF School side note.

Biology 105 A Ecosystem Ecology Wst WA

Explore the ecology of our terrestrial ecosystems and our impacts on them, while learning to recognize common land animals and plants and how they live. For non-science majors. Focus on field trips to local ecosystems. Prerequisite: Placement into both ENGL 105 and MATH 090. Register for 0922.

Construction Industry Training 155 S

Green Building Decisions
Learn to navigate the maze of choices about constructing greener buildings. We will work up a list of underlying green principles, set up a decision matrix and then assess both specific and entire building choices. Examine rating systems like LEEDS and Built Green. Register for 2314.

English 105 K Analytic Writing

Earn your English requirement by reading natural history essays, writing about local sustainability topics, attending Earth Month events, and doing service learning with Eco Encore and a local non-profit environmental organization. Register for 3484.

Environmental Science 100 Environmental Science

A combination of information from biology, chemistry, physics, and geology that stresses a scientific approach towards understanding the nature and scope of current environmental issues. Prerequisite: Placement into both MATH 090 and ENGL 105. Multiple sections offered. See <http://schedule.edcc.edu>.

Geography 150 A Sustainable Development

Introduction to issues in sustainability around the world within a geographic framework. This will involve examination of the development and spatial interactions of policy alternatives relating to the sustainability of resources, the environment, and society. Prerequisite: Placement into ENGL 100. Register for 4780.
